Reading Update - The Premier's Reading Challenge

The Premier's Reading Challenge is a literacy engagement program that was introduced in 2004 to:

- Encourage students to read more books and enjoy reading, and to
- Improve literacy levels.

All students from Reception to Year 12 are encouraged to participate.

Students can read a combination of books from the Challenge booklists and books of their own choosing. Students can choose to read books in languages other than English.

Reception to Year 7 students select at least 8 books from the booklists on the Premier's Reading Challenge website and 4 books of their own choice. Books in our school library are also clearly labelled as inclusive books for each year level.

Students who complete the Challenge receive awards for their achievements:

Certificate – First year, Bronze Medal – Second year, Silver Medal – Third year, Gold Medal – Fourth year, Champion Medal – Fifth year, Legend Medal – Sixth year, Hall of Fame Medal – Seventh year, Reader for Life - Eighth year, Reader for Life Bronze - Ninth year, Reader for Life Silver – Tenth year, Reader for Life Gold – Eleventh year, Reader for Life Champion – Twelfth year, Reader for Life Legend – Thirteenth year, and Reader for Life Hall of Fame – Fourteenth year.

Junior Primary Classes:






Physical Education with Mr Waller Year 3/4/5 Soccer Tournament Information

The Captain's Corner










Last week a School Captain project from last term was finished as a new path from the hall to Room 34 in the GLA was completed.
