Hi everyone,

Last Friday the Year 6/7 students participated in a Cyber Safety session presented by the SA Police. During the session the students learned about some important issues facing them online, including what constitutes cyber bullying and how to ensure they don't become the bully or a victim. They also talked about being safe online and stressed the importance of not placing any personal information online as well as telling parents or trusted adults if they feel unsafe online.

This session was a good reminder to all students on how to be a responsible and respectful online citizen. This is a great time for parents to check in with their children and talk about what they are doing online and the sites or social media they use.

Some things parents can do to keep their children safe online include:

- Find out about the social media your children are using.
- Read the terms and conditions of social media sites, as many are not for children under 14.
- Collect evidence of cyber bullying if it occurs and report it.
- Show your child how to block people on the sites they are using.
- Remind your child to be careful when making friends online, if they don't know them in person, they may not be a good choice for an online friend.
- Encourage your child to share their activity online with you, especially if they feel unsafe.
- Talk to your child about what is appropriate behaviour online.

School SAPSASA Girls Football Team



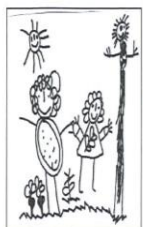
Congratulations to 18 Year 5/6/7 girls who represented the school in the annual Girls Football Carnival last Thursday.
