From the Leadership Team

Hello everyone,

When I look back over Term 3 I am exceedingly proud of our community and the responsibility that everyone has shown over the past 10 weeks of school.

In the first week back at school our state was plunged into a lockdown. We were, however, able to emerge from that lockdown with a clear sense of our personal responsibilities and actions. As a result, our site has been able to reintroduce our much loved Book Week activities, the Primary Schools Festival of Music has once again flourished and we had a very special Discovery Olympics day this term. The responsibility of all to follow Covid strategies such as QR codes, social distancing and wearing a mask, along with adherence to the EPPS protocols at these special events means that we can begin to reintroduce activities that bring joy to our lives. In last week's newsletter I mentioned the growth for R-7 in Phonological Awareness as well as in our Year 1 Phonics Screen Check.

Last week we received student/parent 2021 NAPLAN information, which I would like to share

Our first improvement goal has been;

All students R-7 will develop as balanced readers through the application of rigorous and consistent assessment to inform the planning of quality and differentiated Guided Reading.

In 2021 NAPLAN Reading

Year 3 – 37.1 increase in the Reading mean score, a one band increase in the average band from Band 4 to Band 5, which is two bands above the Standard of Education Achievement and 97% of our Year 3 students achieved the National Minimal Standard. Year 5 - students maintained an average Band 6 result, which is one band above the Standard of Education Achievement and 91% of our Year 5 students achieved the National Minimal Standard. Year 7 - 15.1 increase in the Reading mean score, a one band increase in the average band from Band 6 to Band 7, which is one band above the Standard of Education Achievement and 94% of our Year 7 students achieved the National Minimal Standard.

These results in reading validate the successful work of our students and staff in achieving our improvement goal in reading. Class teachers have also been sharing PAT R (reading results) with me and these results clearly show the impact of our improvement work in reading.

I will detail the other NAPLAN results in our Week 1 newsletter next term.

Online registrations will be opening at: 9am, Wednesday 29th September





Parent Update

Week 10, Term 3 - 2021

Enrolled and ready for 2022

By now, families of our current year 6 and 7 students should have received their enrolment offers for secondary school for next year. If you have not done so, please contact your child's primary school.

The next step is to accept the offer by completing and submitting the enrolment form to the secondary school.

So what happens beyond enrolment? And what can you do to support your child's transition from primary to high school?

Your high school will take it from here

Once you have accepted the enrolment offer your high school will provide you with information about what to expect next year.

Our schools set their own policies on things like uniforms, curriculum resources needed, school fees and mobile phone use.

They also run their own transition programs to help students settle in. Your school will keep you informed about what it has planned. Many secondary schools offer open nights or 'Bring your own device' evenings for students and their families in term 4. Events like this allow you to come into the school, meet some teachers and ask questions.

Of course, there is the possibility some of these events may be impacted by COVID restrictions. If this is the case, your school will find other ways of communicating with you and making sure your child feels welcome.

If you do attend a school event, COVID restrictions may apply, but there will be clear information to follow. This may include using the COVID-SAfe check-in each time you enter the site, wearing a face mask and practicing physical distancing.

Keep an eye out for emails and letters from your high school. You may also like to check their website and follow them on Facebook if they have an account.







Attend transition days

All public high schools will offer transition days to students. They generally occur during term 4. Transition days are fun days that involve school tours, activities and games to help students meet some of their new school friends and teachers. They also help students to become more familiar with the school grounds.

Feedback from our year 7 to high school pilot program showed students enjoyed their transition days and felt more confident about high school after attending them.

As a parent or carer, you can speak positively to your child about transition days and ensure they take part in them.

Start thinking about transport

Adelaide Metro is getting a new fleet of school buses to cater for the extra demand resulting from the year 7 to high school move.

Other school bus services also operate in our regions.

Adelaide Metro timetables for 2022 will be available later in the year, but you might like to start talking to your child about how they will get to and from high school next year.
